## 2015 By the Numbers

*Thank you* for another wonderful year of health and hope! Last year Supplies Over Seas:

- Shipped 11 full cargo containers with a total of 189,959 lbs. (95 tons!) of life-saving supplies and equipment
- Served 90 medical mission teams through the SOS Medical Team Store (7% increase over 2014)
- Volunteers donated 16,836 hours of their time, with a value of \$376,453!
- Partnered with **143** hospitals, doctors offices, and other institutions that donated surplus (30% increase over 2014)
- Thanks to SOS donors, volunteers, and friends, we reached medically impoverished communities in over **50** countries, including the United States.
- Accepted donations of medical supplies from **428** individuals (144% increase over 2014)

## 2015 Local Impact

- Donated **17,615** lbs. to Louisville area/region nonprofits, medical/nursing schools, and animal welfare organizations (17% increase over 2014)
- Saved a total **305,545** lbs. of medical surplus from the landfill (13% increase over 2014)
- Recycled over 81,181 pounds (206% increase over 2014)

Supplies Over Seas is still the only MSRO (Medical Surplus Recovery Organization) in a fairly sizable region – a unique community asset and hometown success story, not just for the healthcare sector but for all of Greater Louisville. Our footprint is expanding more each year across the region, as hospital partners join with us to support their own "green" initiatives to reduce medical waste while expanding their lifesaving missions across the globe.

Our mission also fits well with the Mayor's Compassionate City movement; indeed, compassion is at the heart of what we do. Our board of directors adopted a Compassionate Louisville Resolution in 2013 that exemplifies how the SOS mission works towards a more compassionate city. In the following pages is an overview of the incredible work that goes on here every day – how the efforts of our volunteers, the ongoing support of donors large and small, and the responsible redistribution of usable medical surplus make all the difference for those who lack even the most basic medical care.


## **OUR VISION**

### **Donate Your Own Medical Surplus**


